APPLICATIONS ARE DUE NO LATER THAN APRIL 12th, 2024.

For your application to be considered, you will need to:

1. Show that your garden is easily accessible to the neighborhood. You must provide a physical address. A phone interview and site visit will be made before grants are awarded.
2. Demonstrate that your garden is for personal and neighborhood use only. This grant funding does not support market or school gardens.
3. Provide documentation of participation in a community garden leadership training program.
4. Show it is a COMMUNITY garden. Relatives are encouraged to garden together. However, at least three different households need to be represented in the garden.
5. New community gardens should conduct a soil test and a site assessment.
6. It is expected that all community gardens have all necessary permits or agreements for property or water use as required.
